For 60 years, the peaceful Alpine valley of Belleville has become the world's leading tourist destination for winter sports, welcoming 600,000 visitors from November to May. A multifaceted valley that draws its strength from the complementary nature of the three resorts: Val Thorens, Les Menuires, and Saint-Martin-de-Belleville.

Back to the roots

From 600 to 3,200 meters in altitude, from flower-strewn pastures to snow-capped peaks, the Vallée des Belleville broadens horizons. From the typical village of Saint-Martin-de-Belleville to the peaks of Val Thorens, passing by the mountain lakes of Les Menuires, the green of the meadows gives way to the blue of the glaciers, exploring all the Alpine nuances. A journey moving upwards, meeting three unique and contrasting territories, whose richness and diversity make this destination so varied, both daring and authentic.

Here, in a single day, the possibilities are endless thanks to the free shuttles and ski lifts open seven days a week, facilitating access and movement between each village. As the altitude changes, one can opt for gentle activities and discover the valley through trails, on foot or by mountain bike. Meditate on the peaks with a view of Mont Blanc. Explore the mountain lakes and streams. Then conclude this long journey with a discovery of the local territory and Belleville traditions.

A REFRESHING STAY

Four great reasons to head for the Vallée des Belleville!

Water, air, and coolness! The Vallée des Belleville offers an ideal refuge to fully enjoy the summer and escape the heatwave. Here, nights are cool, the air is pure, and the activities refreshing, thanks to the 16 natural mountain lakes, waypoints of invigorating hikes and breathtaking landscapes. On the agenda...

My first glacier hike

As the saying goes, "the mountain belongs to those who rise early"! In other words, earning your glacier hike means setting off at dawn with crampons, helmet, ice axe and rope, heading to the Col du Bouchet perched at 2,995 meters in altitude, for a return in the early afternoon.

Guided by high mountain guides, the route allows both novice and experienced hikers to climb the "Three Passes"; after a short approach walk, a first ascent allows incredible panoramas from the Col de Thorens (3,105 m). A superb crossing then leads to the Col Pierre Lory (3,132 m) before descending through the Col du Bouchet (2,995 m).

Bivouac in a Mini Countryman: "Zest for life"

This is a unique experience. The chance to board a Mini Countryman and spend the night under the stars, with family or friends. Equipped with a roof tent and all the necessary camping gear, head to the shores of Lac de Tête de Ronde (2,450 m) for a sunset barbecue with a magnificent view over Val Thorens and the peaks. A friendly moment meant for budding adventurers and seasoned explorers who wish to find a bit of coolness!

Stroll to Lac Blanc: "The Call of the Wild Blue"

Contrary to what its name might suggest, Lac Blanc is dazzling blue with its turquoise water! Nestled in an almost lunar setting, this glacial mountain lake is a heavenly spot to contemplate the high mountain panorama surrounding it. Located at the foot of the Péclet Glacier, at an altitude of 2.749 m. it is accessible via a hiking trail where vegetation gradually gives way to a mineral landscape.



The arrival at the refuge offers an exceptional panorama of the torrent de la Platière, at the foot of the majestic Cheval Noir. An ideal stroll to discover mountain pastures, observe the flora, and encounter marmots.

With the Belleville Valley nature guide... Water in all its forms

Because water is a rare, precious, and fundamental natural resource in the mountains, it is important to preserve and secure it. The Belleville Valley offers two activities focused on water, a theme more topical than ever.

- "Glacier" animation to learn everything about the life of a glacier, its different forms, and the resulting reliefs. Meeting at Lac de Tête Ronde in Val Thorens - Duration 2 hrs.
- "Wetland and water cycle" animation to discover wetlands and their functions, fragile ecosystems useful for preserving biodiversity. Meeting at Plan d'Eau des Bruyères in Les Menuires.

They are two communal, unguarded cabins, renovated two years ago, offering hikers a complimentary overnight stay. They invite guests to an authentic and friendly experience in a natural setting where one can feel disconnected from the world. Enjoy a 'micro adventure' escape with family or friends.

Refuges and Women

Three out of four refuges are managed by Women

The Vallée des Belleville is filled with guarded refuges where nature and authenticity blend in a feminine touch.

Among the four shelters, three are managed by women: the Nant Brun refuge by Violaine and Amandine (1,510 m), Lac du Lou (2,045 m) by Marie and Coralie and Trait d'Union (1,725 m) by accordian-playing Vivian Hudry. The sole exception is the Plan Lombardie refuge (1,764 m), overseen by a male quardian!

Refuge Le Nant Brun: a little slice of heaven

Located at a bend, in the heart of a charming typical alpine hamlet in the wild Nant Brun valley at 1,510 m altitude, the refuge of the same name reopened last summer after a four-year hiatus. The two friends, Violaine and Amandine, decided to take over this enchanting spot. In this splendid environment, where endless hiking and mountain biking opportunities abound, vacationers can enjoy a well-deserved break.

Whether it's for lunch, dinner, or an overnight stay, all is possible! The food on offer aims to be simple and family-oriented, spotlighting local, fresh, and seasonal produce. The tastefully redone decor allows guests, under the watchful eyes of the two young women, to enjoy a magical break in a true haven of tranquility.

Both passionate and having settled in the Vallée des Belleville for over 10 years, Violaine and Amandine have embarked on this significant adventure. A well-considered career change for these two friends, more determined than ever. Violaine, employed in the urban planning department of Belleville's town hall, has honed her skills in other shelters over several seasons. Amandine, a nurse, draws on her in-laws' and husband's mountain experience, natives of Belleville.

Their goal? To be open all year round, including the low season[weekends only], for locals. A life project coming together, a dream turning into reality.

Unveiled - A high-altitude permaculture garden at Chez Pépé Nicolas: a nurturing land! - 1,950 m

Chez Pépé Nicolas is known for its restaurant, alpine farm, and cheese factory... but also for its sustainable alpine garden located at 1,950 m altitude. With aromatic plants, edible flowers, and vegetables, this nurturing garden is a true source of inspiration for the restaurant's menu.

A little backstory: the family of Chez Pépé Nicolas - Margot, Valentin, Lucie, and Thierry Suchet - enlisted Christophe Gonthier, a landscape architect from Chambéry, to create a high-altitude garden reflecting their shared concerns for environmental protection and their commitment to short supply chains.

Not to overlook the educational purpose of the garden which offers a thirty-minute guided tour by Joseph the gardener, to explore various permaculture techniques (aromatic spirals, raised garden beds, mounds, terraces, ponds, hotbeds...). A delicious and fascinating dive into the heart of the Belleville valley!

The Black Bee and Nature House: all about honey and bees!

At the heart of the vallée des Encombres, a different kind of animal takes centre stage: "Apis Mellifera Mellifera", better known as the black bee, has seen its genetic heritage threatened over the years. Yet, its ability to adapt to the harsh winter conditions and the longevity of its workers make it an essential bee to preserve. The Black Bee and Nature House offers insights into the origins and daily life of the insect. Set in a former alpine chalet close to the Bruyères water body, this educational and awareness-raising venue allows visitors to follow "Apis Mellifera Mellifera" through its adventures and those of the local beekeepers.

Kelly Duqueine, beekeeper and queen breeder


Kelly shares with enthusiasm and conviction the passion that drives her: bees. After working in Canada for 12 years as a beekeeper for an industrial company, this forty-something mountain lover wanted to return to the traditional dimension of her profession in France. In close collaboration with the Conservatory working for the preservation of the black bee, Kelly aims to rehabilitate the genetics of Apis Mellifera Mellifera and ensure its preservation in the heart of the vallée des Belleville. From the end of April to the end of September, she is "hands-on with the hives". Every summer, between 500 and 600 gueens are bred in the mating apiary of the vallée des Encombres, which features 300 mating "nuclei", tiny hives designed to welcome the gueen and her about 1,000 bees taking care of her. Kelly offers guided tours and discovery workshops as part of a public awareness initiative, every Friday.

A heartfelt encounter with a passionate Bellevilloise, who speaks emotionally about the nature in which she raises her queens.

The Ludizone: Mini Bike Park

Whether alone or accompanied by an instructor, everyone can train and have fun on this natural playground, sculpted to reflect the mountainous landscapes! This mini Bike Park is 100% dedicated to mountain biking initiation and consists of 4 courses of increasing difficulty (green, blue, red, and black). An area for balance bikes including an obstacle course is also available for the youngest ones, starting from 18 months, to learn how to balance or manage turns while having fun.

The Menuires Pump Track: adrenaline rush!

This closed circuit, consisting of bumps and curves designed so that users can advance without ever needing to pedal or put their feet on the ground, is accessible to all types of riders: skateboards, rollerblades, bicycles, scooters, or balance bikes. The Menuires track offers 3 levels of difficulty (green, blue, and red) over an area of 2,000 m².

The Via 3 Vallées... the royal road

Opened in 2022, this 34 km tarmac cycle path weaves through the mountains from Courchevel to Val Thorens via Méribel and Les Menuires. Accessible to families on electric bikes as well as to accomplished sport cyclists, it is exclusively dedicated to cyclists and remains separate from the pedestrian trails. While it includes some road sections, particularly on the stretch between Méribel and Mottaret, it primarily traverses the mountain, winding through meadows. At the peaks, cyclists find themselves alone in the world, faced with a breathtaking panorama.


2024 Edition: New route

On the agenda: a brewers' fair featuring a dozen regional professionals; brewing demonstrations; a contest for the "Best Beer of the Beer Festival 2024" judged by the eminent beer expert Emmanuel Gillard; fun and educational workshops to discover beer making; tastings... An opportunity to discover and fall in love with 100% local beers! As for entertainment, this edition is marked by new highlights: an open-air dance hall evening followed by a concert on Friday night and a colourful musical evening with a concert and DJ on Saturday night.

A French craft beer market expert, tasting organiser, and tegestophile (a collector of beer coasters!), Emmanuel Gillard boasts over 20,100 tastings, including 7,800 French beers! Author of "La bière en France - Edition 2021", contributor to Bière Magazine in 2018, Gillard has also founded the Association for the Promotion of Artisanal Belgian Beer. He is currently working on two books dedicated to understanding different beer styles and flavours. In a word, he certainly has reasons to froth!

Brava Vela, a 100% Bellevilloise microbrewery

In the village of Le Châtelard in the heart of Belleville, the valley's first microbrewery was born. Set up in a former goat farm, Julien and Sophie brew beers respecting the values they hold dear: commitment, authenticity, and local craftsmanship. Their range is tailored to the setting, with beer names that reflect the connection to the mountain and the three surrounding domains: "La Masse", a bold brown ale, "La Belleville", a light and golden blonde, and "La Thorens", a white beer with citrus notes. But that's not all. **97% of the ingredients used are 100% local,** from malt to hops, and of course, the water flowing from the surrounding streams. But ultimately, what does Brava Vela mean...? **It's simply "Belleville" translated into Savoyard dialect.**

Portrait of two young brewers from the Valley



For Julien and Sophie, it's a long-held dream come true. He comes from the world of hospitality, passionate about brewing craftsmanship. She, more analytical and trained in science, still works in the healthcare sector. Together, they decided to embark on this beautiful journey, relying on their expertise and camaraderie. Julien has been brewing his own beers for 10 years, starting with ready-made kits in his cellar, then "in my mother's old pot". Having settled in the Vallée des Belleville four years ago, it was here they were able to realise their project after undergoing two training courses to hone their skills and investing in professional equipment. Their ambition: to combine art and science to create quality beers. A successful gamble with the creation of Brava Vela, beers brewed at 1.400 m altitude, with love.

The wheel turns!

On the occasion of the national mill day, the village of Saint-Martin-de-Belleville is hosting an open day at the Moulin du Burdin, dating back to the 17th century, which provided wheat, barley, and oat flour to the Bellevillois for nearly two centuries.

The schedule includes the (re)discovery of the Valley's agropastoral past as well as current sustainable energies. Guided tours, the starting of the Mill, and wheat grinding demonstrations will highlight the day. Access to the site is available on foot, by mountain bike, or by horse-drawn carriage to promote soft mobility!

Adjacent to this event, a "sustainable energies" route with 7 educational totems invites both young and old to operate a miniature wooden cable car using a micro-turbine or to rebuild an alpine chalet based on the principle of geothermal energy! This circuit perfectly illustrates the environmental initiatives launched in the Vallée des Belleville (solar panels, micro-hydroelectric plant, biomass boilers...).


